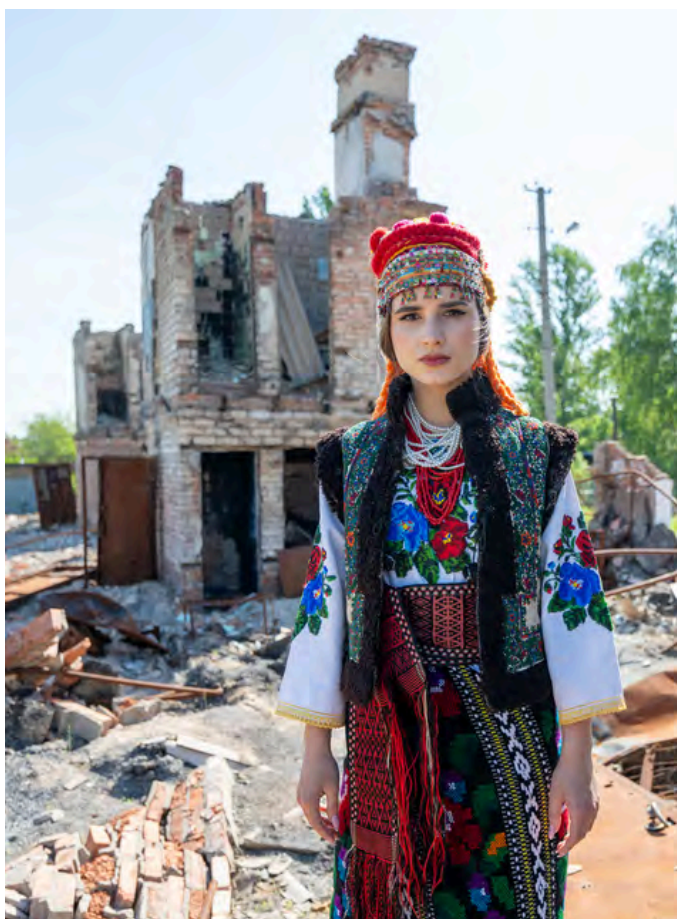

Recap: More than 1,000 Days of War

The end of 2024 marks 1,042 days of the full-scale invasion in Ukraine and nearly 11 years since Russia's aggression began in eastern Ukraine. The toll of this war is staggering. According to the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights (OHCHR), there have been **39,081 civilian casualties** (injury or death) since February 2022.

Millions have been uprooted from their homes—**3.7 million people are internally displaced** within Ukraine, while **6.2 million refugees** have sought safety abroad. Inside the country, **14.6 million people require humanitarian assistance** to survive.



Despite these dire circumstances, **humanitarian organisations reached 6.7 million individuals** with some form of aid in the first eight months of 2024, and Ukrainian Patriot is honoured to be among those providing critical assistance.

16 children
per week

on average have been killed or injured due to the war since February 2022 (UNICEF, 18 November 2024).

Life in Ukraine continues under extraordinary strain. **Air raid sirens are a daily reality**, bringing cities to a halt as business pauses and public transportation stops. **Blackouts persist** due to attacks on power infrastructure, leaving residents with no electricity. When you walk down a street in Kyiv during the winter, the hum of generators will be your soundtrack, allowing some businesses to carry on.

Checkpoints operated by defenders are stationed between regions to monitor and control movement. **A nationwide curfew**, with times varying between regions, limits activity during specific hours to ensure public safety. In Kyiv, for example, people must be indoors from midnight to 5 a.m., while in Kherson, the curfew is from 8 p.m to 6 a.m. Public transit stops during these hours, though metro stations remain open as shelters.

Events and daily routines are adapted to accommodate these restrictions, reflecting a way of life shaped by war.

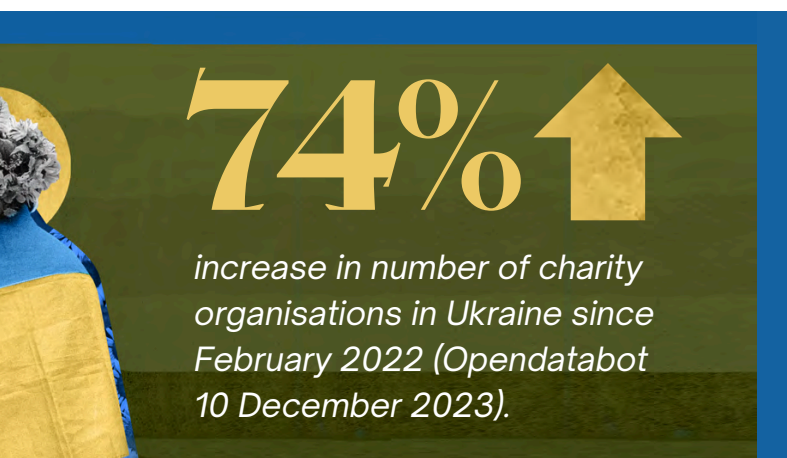


And yet, even through all this, hope endures. Those who are able to try to go on with their lives as best as they can. Maybe they attend a musical concert—which will start in the early evening so people can make it home before curfew. But those same people may go home only to be awakened by an air raid siren and then spend the night in a bomb shelter. Or perhaps they show up on time for work every day, then return home to take part in their own fundraising efforts for the frontlines.

In Ukraine, the sense of civic duty is palpable. **Everyone is stepping up, contributing in their own way,** despite the immense pressures of war. The resilience and strength of Ukrainians radiate everywhere, a testament to their unwavering spirit. Our volunteers who spend time on the ground in Ukraine often remark on the powerful community spirit that surrounds them.

Ukraine is a country united by a shared determination—to do everything possible to bring an end to the war and protect those they love. This collective resilience and purpose leave a lasting impression on everyone who experiences it.

The effects of this war are felt far beyond the frontlines. Ukrainians, enduring profound loss and daily hardships, press on with remarkable courage. But their resilience is bolstered by collective support. **Standing together, we can help Ukraine persevere** and work toward rebuilding a future of hope and security.

Operating in a war zone presents relentless challenges, but Ukrainian Patriot continues to deliver vital aid across Ukraine with resilience and innovation. Despite having only two full-time and eight part-time staff, we leverage the power of **more than 100 committed volunteers** from across the world and Points of Contact (POCs) within local communities.

This approach allows us to assess needs in real-time, adapt quickly to shifting conditions, and **ensure aid reaches those who need it most.**

We have served **more than 11 oblasts (regions) and 50 towns, cities, and locations around Ukraine**, and our long-term goal is to ensure that communities can sustain themselves, with or without international aid. Through enhanced logistics, data-driven decision-making, and deep community engagement, we are maximising our impact.

Despite declining international support and escalating challenges, we remain steadfast, adapting to meet the evolving needs of a nation defending itself during war. Our mission goes beyond delivering aid—**it's about rebuilding hope, resilience, and dignity in the face of adversity.**

Transparency is crucial for any humanitarian aid organisation. During the ongoing conflict in Ukraine, it's essential to work with trusted partners and uphold the highest standards of accountability. Ukrainian Patriot upholds this by carefully vetting collaborators and maintaining the highest standards of reliability.

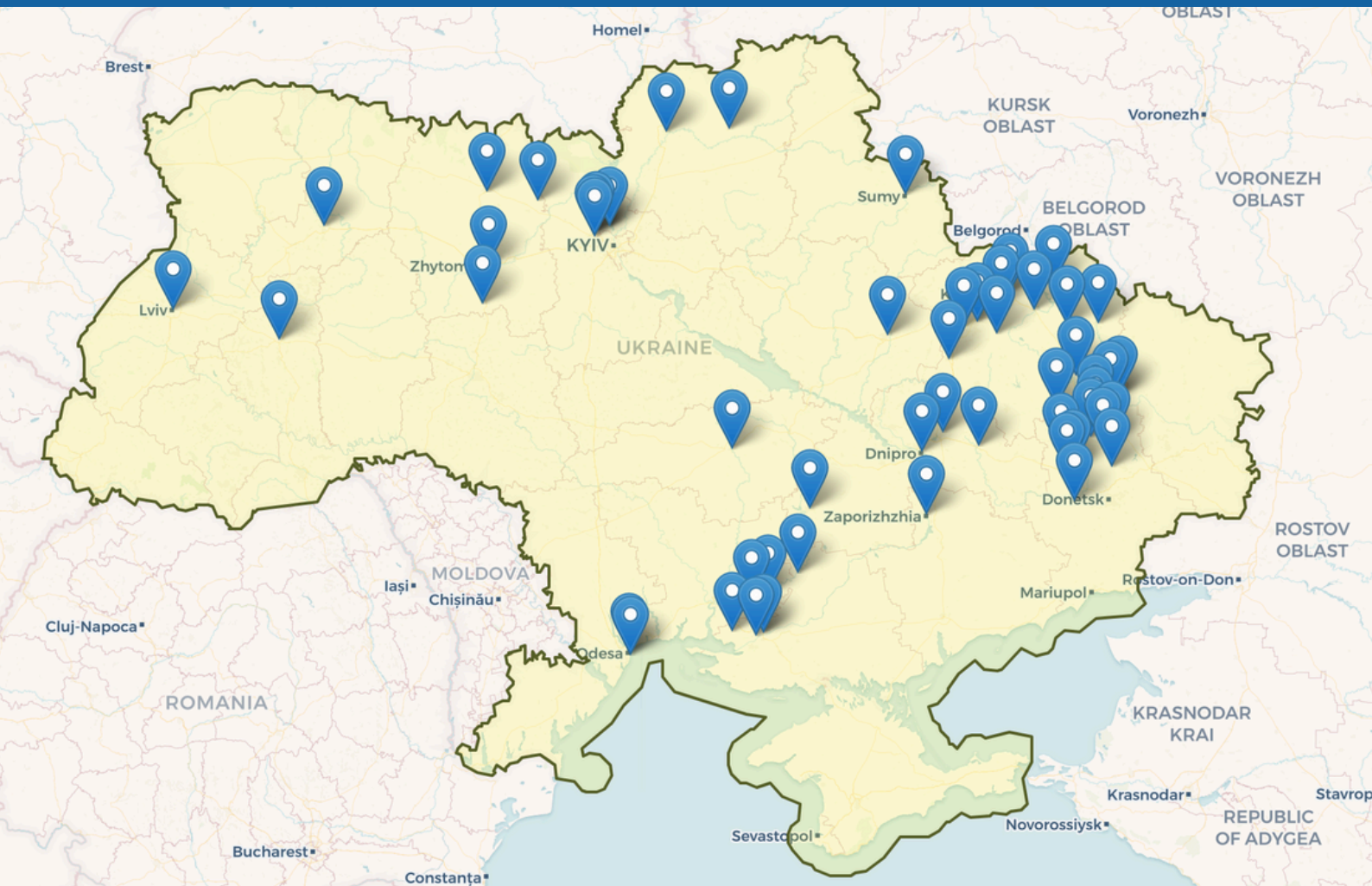

Throughout this report, we will delve deeper into each pillar and its impact. We will also share powerful stories from the frontlines that illustrate the profound difference Ukrainian Patriot and our supporters make in the lives of many across Ukraine.

What drives us:





PILLAR 1

Humanitarian Aid

Ukrainian Patriot’s humanitarian aid efforts focus on providing immediate relief to communities facing the dire consequences of war. This includes essential supplies such as food, water, clothing, and heating solutions.

Our distribution goes beyond aid delivery—we provide hope, trust, and human connection to communities devastated by war. From frontline villages to recently liberated areas, we ensure families receive the essentials they need to survive while letting them know they are not forgotten.

 - **Trusted logistics:** Partnering with Nova Poshta and other reliable providers to reach high-risk areas.

 - **Local engagement:** Working closely with Points of Contact (POCs) to ensure aid reaches those who need it most.

Since February 2022, we have delivered hundreds of thousands of food bags and essential items to vulnerable families, ensuring that basic needs are met even in the most unstable conditions.

CASE STUDY

General Frontline Support

At Ukrainian Patriot, we believe in delivering more than just supplies—we bring *light, love, hope, and connection* to communities in crisis. While we distribute vital items like food bags, hygiene kits, cleaning supplies, and generators, our focus is on empowering those we support. These tangible resources help families and individuals endure the hardest days, but it's the humanity we deliver alongside them that leaves a lasting impact.

In frontline cities like Iziurm, Kharkiv oblast, where the scars of occupation remain visible, we've shifted toward a sustainable approach by sourcing food bags locally and involving the community in their assembly. This not only supports local economies but also fosters resilience.

Food bags have become a lifeline for many families. With increasing food prices and disrupted supply chains, our food bags are essential for civilians and frontline workers. Each bag is thoughtfully packed to include not just essentials but also small comforts like tinned fruit and chocolate, bringing moments of joy amidst hardship. We also prioritise medics and first responders—unsung heroes often overlooked in aid distribution—ensuring they have the sustenance to continue their critical work.

In Orlyvschyna, Dnipro Oblast, we met a community disheartened by unfulfilled promises from previous organisations. By delivering food bags directly and engaging with residents, we rebuilt trust and restored hope. The heartfelt messages of gratitude we received underscored the importance of showing up, keeping our word, and providing not just aid, but a sense of connection.

Throughout the winter, our support expands to include thermal blankets, generators, and self-heating food and drink cans from 42 Degrees, helping civilians and defenders endure harsh freezing conditions. Additionally, through partnerships with organisations specialising in refurbishing generators, we provide high-quality equipment at reduced costs to support critical infrastructure and frontline homes, ensuring warmth and resilience during the most challenging months.

CASE STUDY

Evacuating to Safety

In the early days of the full-scale invasion, Ukrainian Patriot began our evacuation efforts with one of our volunteers, Dave, and a trusty vehicle we named Audrey. Purchased by our team, Audrey became a lifeline, enabling Dave to conduct hundreds of evacuations from frontline areas to safer communities. Over time, however, the emotional toll of this vital work prompted Dave to step back, and in 2023, Audrey returned to our care.

Although evacuations today are not a primary focus of our operations, we continue to assist when the opportunity arises.

In September 2024, during one of our missions, we helped a women named Alyona and her mother evacuate from Kostyantynivka, Donetsk oblast, to Kamianske, Dnipro oblast. They brought their belongings, including a cat, their TV, and a washing machine, symbolising their hope to start fresh amidst the turmoil. The journey was bittersweet—while they were finding safety, they knew they would likely never return to their home.

When we arrived at their temporary new home, Alyona embraced us with tears in her eyes, offering a 500-hryvnia note as a gesture of gratitude. She said, “Take this, please. You’ve helped us, and I hope you use it to help others.”

This gesture reminds us even in the toughest of times, we stand together, paying it forward, and never losing hope.

Amid the relentless threat of occupation and destruction, Ivan made the heartbreaking decision to leave his hometown of Kostyantynivka, Donetsk oblast, to find safety in Kharkiv, Kharkiv oblast, in December 2024. For our crew, navigating artillery fire, disrupted GPS signals, and block posts to reach him was a daunting challenge. Yet, Ivan's heartfelt gratitude for our unwavering commitment to Ukraine and its people reaffirmed the profound importance of our mission.

In mid-October 2024, we had the honour of evacuating three resilient *babusy* (grandmothers) from the frontline town of Kostyantynivka, Donetsk oblast, to the safety of Polyvanivka village in Dnipro region. Despite the immense hardships they've endured, these remarkable women showed their gratitude by baking homemade pies for our crew, a simple but profound act of kindness that touched us all.

CASE STUDY

Animal Shelters

Ukrainian Patriot is a steadfast supporter of animal shelters across Ukraine, including one in Kostyantynivka, Donetsk oblast, an area under constant shelling as Russian forces push closer. Home to many cats and dogs left vulnerable by the conflict, the shelter faces immense challenges—from food shortages to a lack of medical supplies and the struggle to keep the animals warm during harsh winters.

We were first connected with the shelter after receiving a request from one of our contacts to evacuate eight puppies. Already having movements in this part of the country, we stepped in to assist, because war doesn't only affect people—it also devastates the environment, wildlife, and countless animals, including cats and dogs.

We evacuated the puppies to Kharkiv, Kharkiv oblast, where they received treatment and were rehomed with families.

Since this first request, we've delivered essential medicines, heaters for the cold months, and pet food, all to support the animals currently in their care.

In the first year of the full-scale invasion,
the number of animals in frontline shelters

more than doubled

according to research by Save Pets of Ukraine and Kormotech.



The shelter, lovingly run by Alyona and her husband, serves as a sanctuary for animals who have endured the trauma of war. While evacuating all the animals isn't yet possible, we help by improving their quality of life, providing food, medicine, and support to ensure they find comfort and care in the midst of chaos.

This work goes beyond providing essentials—it's about extending compassion and a lifeline to those who cannot speak for themselves, animals profoundly affected by the devastation of war.

Together, we can continue to bring hope, comfort, and care to these animals and the incredible people who dedicate their lives to protecting them.

PILLAR 2

Medical Supplies and Equipment

The war has placed immense strain on Ukraine's healthcare system, making Ukrainian Patriot's medical aid a critical lifeline for hospitals, medical units, and defenders. We address urgent medical needs by sourcing, delivering, and refurbishing equipment that saves lives.



Key initiatives include:

-
- **Essential supplies:** Providing personal protective equipment (PPE), first aid kits, surgical tools, and hospital equipment, including beds, to those in need.

 - **Frontline support:** Assisting medical units on the frontlines with bandages, medications, and trauma kits to save lives in high-risk areas.

 - **Partnerships for impact:** Collaborating with donors and partners to refurbish and deliver critical medical devices, ensuring life-saving resources reach where they're needed most.

From portable ventilators and incubators to essential first aid supplies and PPE, Ukrainian Patriot's medical aid saves lives and strengthens the ability of hospitals and frontline medical units to respond swiftly and effectively to emergencies.



We received a semi-trailer full of medical gowns and gloves in June 2024 to distribute to hospitals across Ukraine.

In July 2024, Ukrainian Patriot conducted a crucial supply drop at Karabelesha Kherson City Hospital, situated on the frontline in Kherson. The hospital received essential supplies aimed at bolstering their frontline efforts amidst challenging conditions.



CASE STUDY

Vital Aid for Hospitals


We support many hospitals across Ukraine, including the Barvinkove military hospital in Kharkiv oblast, which has become a trusted lifeline for those injured on the frontlines. This hospital provides exceptional care in a clean, orderly, and welcoming environment. It's a place where patients find not only medical assistance but also a sense of hope and community.

Throughout the year, we have regularly supported the hospital with essential supplies, including 300 cleaning kits containing hand soap, laundry detergent, toilet paper, and dish soap. These deliveries ensure the hospital can maintain the high hygiene standards crucial in its daily operations.

Beyond supplies, our team has connected deeply with the community, sharing moments of gratitude over coffee and creating bonds with the staff and patients.

One touching moment during our delivery in October 2024 stands out. After we unloaded our van, a defender who looked like he had recently recovered from an injury approached one of our international volunteers and asked to take a selfie. It caught her by surprise but served as a beautiful reminder of the hope and unity our presence brings.

Seeing Ukrainian Patriot volunteers—both local and international—standing side by side with Ukraine reinforces the idea that Ukrainians are not alone, and the world remembers them.

Why are hospitals experiencing supply shortages?

Hospitals in Ukraine are experiencing critical shortages of PPE, medical equipment, and other supplies due to direct attacks and supply chain disruptions caused by the ongoing conflict, making donations essential.

CASE STUDY

Stabilisation Points

Since the start of the full-scale invasion, Ukrainian Patriot has prioritised delivering medical aid to frontline communities. What began as volunteers bringing over supplies in suitcases has evolved into receiving shipping containers of medical essentials. In 2024 alone, we received six such shipments, enabling us to supply critical resources to hospitals and stabilisation points.

Stabilisation points, often the first line of care for casualties from the frontlines, are vital in saving lives. These field hospitals stabilise patients before transferring them to more equipped facilities. We ensure that these points have the supplies they need—personal protective equipment (PPE), gowns, gloves, stretchers, and secondhand medical equipment donated by hospitals across Europe. Our volunteers at our warehouse swiftly inventory these items, which are sometimes nearing expiration, so we can distribute them and they can be put to use where they are needed most.

Through partnerships and the tireless efforts of our volunteers, we continue to reinforce the frontlines and provide life-saving aid. Your support enables this mission, which drives change and delivers hope where it's needed most.



Charlie, our bright orange motorcycle, has been instrumental in our humanitarian missions. In summer 2024, we passed Charlie on to another dedicated organisation, Перезавантаження, where it will continue its critical work. Charlie now transports blood from clinics to stabilisation points along the front, saving countless lives.

PILLAR 3

Protective Gear

Safety is paramount for those defending Ukraine and civilians in conflict zones. Ukrainian Patriot provides reliable, high-quality protective gear tailored to the needs of those on the ground.

Key initiatives include:

- Distribution of helmets, body armour, and gas mask filters
- Vehicles, vehicle maintenance, and reinforcement to ensure safe passage through combat zones
- Partnerships with trusted suppliers and donors to source essential equipment

By supplying protective gear, we safeguard lives, enabling defenders to operate in high-risk environments with confidence.



We have partnered with The 42 Degrees Company to deliver self-heating food and drink cans to defenders, including in Zaporizhzhia oblast in November 2024.

CASE STUDY

Supporting Defenders

Ukrainian Patriot first connected with Oleg in 2022 through a Ukrainian woman in Germany who was seeking tourniquets for his battalion. That introduction blossomed into an enduring relationship grounded in trust and unwavering support. On Easter Sunday 2024, we met Oleg again at our Kyiv warehouse to pass along a much-needed vehicle for his unit. Beyond the vehicle, our Easter delivery included tourniquets, chocolates, cookies, and drawings from children abroad, lovingly packed by our volunteers. These simple yet meaningful gestures brought light and hope to Oleg's battalion, a testament to the power of connection and solidarity.

Later in October, we made an important delivery to Oleg and his battalion: a fully repaired vehicle that our mechanics worked on over the summer. Now, it's ready to help navigate the scarred, potholed roads on the frontlines. Vehicles like these are absolutely vital—they're more than just transport; they're lifelines for defenders who face increasingly challenging terrain and unpredictable drone attacks. Whenever Oleg reaches out for help, Ukrainian Patriot answers, ensuring he has a steadfast team behind him throughout the war.

Another defender who regularly stays on our radar is Vitya. We first met Vitaliy in 2022 during a couple of days of heavy attacks in Bakhmut, Donetsk oblast. As chaos unfolded, our crew helped Vitya and his battalion clean up areas in the city, then transported an injured defender to a hospital as further attacks chased us out of Bakhmut.

That intense experience forged a lasting bond. In December 2024, Vitya and his team received 20 individual first aid kits (IFAKs) and 20 defender ration packs filled with goods to provide comfort and care while on the frontlines.



Karina, a combat medic from Odesa, embodies courage and care. Along the eastern front, she works tirelessly with her unit to evacuate and stabilise the wounded, ensuring they can recover in hospitals away from the frontlines. Ukrainian Patriot has collaborated with her to provide the resources her team needs to carry out their life-saving work.

These three defenders—Oleg, Vitya, and Karina—represent the resilience and dedication of many. Ukrainian Patriot stands by them and countless others, ensuring they have the support needed so all Ukrainians can do what they need to do: not just to survive, but to thrive.

Ration Packs

We were proud to launch our defender ration packs in 2024. We asked defenders what they missed most and put together care packages to deliver to them. These packs include things like coffee, chocolate and sweets, and vitamin C.

These brave men and women endure the harshest realities: cold, wet trenches, relentless danger, and time away from their families. One defender put it best: “A Snickers bar can make three days in a trench bearable.”

Small moments of connection remind defenders they are not forgotten, even amidst the turmoil of war. It’s not just about the supplies; it’s about the light and love we carry with us, showing them that their sacrifices matter.

since the onset of russia's full-scale invasion, reported Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy in December 2024.

We're proud to deliver **Individual First Aid Kits (IFAKs)** to the frontlines. These kits include essentials like tourniquets, bandages, and medical tools, giving defenders and civilians the immediate care they need in life-threatening situations.



Our partnership with **Nova Poshta (NP)** allows us to ship packages across Ukraine free of charge up to a certain amount each month, meaning we can reach high-risk areas where direct travel can be too dangerous. In October 2024, they helped us deliver tires to a unit on the frontlines.

In a war-torn country where infrastructure is severely damaged and logistics are challenging, NP has been a lifeline, helping us bridge the gap between hope and reality. Whether it's medical supplies, food bags, or essential equipment, NP makes sure every package arrives on time, every time.



PILLAR 4

PTSD and Psychological Trauma Assistance

The psychological toll of war is profound, and Ukrainian Patriot is committed to addressing mental health through trauma-informed care and community resilience programming. This pillar empowers individuals to rebuild emotionally and spiritually, fostering long-term recovery.

Key initiatives include:

-
- **Resilience Sessions:** Art as therapy, dance, yoga, and facilitated conversations in frontline communities to reduce isolation and build community strength

 - **Holistic Housing Project:** Safe, restorative spaces for healing, including renovated dachas with wraparound mental health services

 - **Therapy Farm:** Developing a nurturing environment for agri-therapy and animal-assisted recovery

 - **Women's Safe House:** Providing shelter, vocational training, and psychosocial support to women and children

From individual therapy to community-wide resilience hubs, our mental health programs help children, women, and defenders heal and find hope in the aftermath of trauma.

CASE STUDY

Summer Camps for Kids

In 2024, we began hosting summer children’s camps, particularly for children living in frontline areas and those from disadvantaged backgrounds. These camps offer a critical safe haven where children can experience normalcy, learn, and play, despite the dangers of war. We put on three camps in 2024. Ensuring the requisite infrastructure—policies, practices, and procedures—are in place will be a key focus as we continue hosting these camps.



In Taranivka, Kharkiv oblast, we hosted more than 40 children, aged 3 to 15. They joined us for two days of activities, including Ukrainian dance, art as therapy, and English lessons. One particularly beloved activity was an English-based treasure hunt. As children searched for hidden clues around the property, they practised their language skills in a fun, interactive way. The camp also featured movement exercises, soccer matches, and shared meals, including sandwiches and watermelons brought by our volunteers. These simple yet joyful moments fostered a sense of community and brought smiles to everyone’s faces.

Due to current circumstances in Ukraine, many parents are understandably cautious about letting their children stay away from home overnight. We ensured that the children could return home safely each night, providing peace of mind for their families.

We also held a weeklong camp in Obukhivka, Dnipro oblast, thanks to the generosity of a young girl in the United States who raised \$10,000 to benefit Ukrainian children.

This week was filled with laughter, learning, and unforgettable memories, all made possible by a generous heart across the ocean.

Looking ahead, we plan to establish a dedicated camp location in western Ukraine, allowing for expanded programming. The goal is to create a nurturing environment where participants can grow, learn, and heal.

CASE STUDY

Resilience Sessions and Dance as Therapy

After the positive feedback from our summer camp, we wanted to find a way to continue the meaningful, therapeutic activities we offered. We adjusted our programming to allow us to hold Resilience Sessions over one day, two days, or even one afternoon. We can host these sessions anywhere, allowing us to meet the kids in their hometowns, including in frontline communities. In 2024, we held 11 Resilience Sessions.

During the sessions, we incorporate art, dance, English lessons, and other activities to create a safe space for healing and connection. When our dance as therapy sessions first started in 2023, many children were withdrawn, cautious, and overwhelmed by the trauma of occupation and war. But the power of music and dance proved transformative. As the music played, children began to move, shedding fear and finding joy in each step. Dance as therapy doesn't just facilitate movement—it *is* the therapy. It allows children to express themselves freely, breaking through emotional barriers in ways words often cannot.

We also began offering Women’s Resilience Sessions to provide a lifeline for those navigating the daily challenges of conflict. These sessions offer a safe space for emotional expression through art, gentle movement, and open discussions. Women are guided to reflect, share, and heal, fostering a sense of calm and connection. Whether drawing, practising yoga, or simply being heard, participants rediscover strength and solidarity.

Adaptable and community-focused, Ukrainian Patriot Resilience Sessions meet participants where they are, bringing therapeutic support and empowerment directly to frontline communities. By blending creativity, movement, and connection, Ukrainian Patriot helps participants of all ages find resilience and hope.

CASE STUDY

Therapy Farm and Holistic Housing

Our Therapy Farm and Holistic Housing are two vital projects aimed at fostering recovery and renewal for those impacted by war. These initiatives will provide much-needed spaces for rest, rejuvenation, and healing.

Our Therapy Farm is envisioned as a comprehensive sanctuary for PTSD recovery. Focusing on comprehensive care, the farm will combine psychological support with physical and emotional renewal. Though we are actively looking for a new location to ensure the Therapy Farm's permanence, our volunteers have begun work on the current property, just outside of Kyiv, where horses and their caregivers are providing mental health support to everyone who visits.

Set to open in spring 2025, our Holistic Housing pilot project is a dacha-style (cottage-style) home in Kyiv oblast. It will serve as a retreat for those coping with war-related trauma, offering intensive psychological support and a welcoming space for recovery.

Through Holistic Housing, we will support Ukrainian defenders and their families, including those demobilised due to physical or mental health challenges. Frontline civilians who played critical roles are also eligible. Each dacha can house one family of four to six, for three to seven days, serving 25 families per year at each location.

Together, these projects reflect Ukrainian Patriot's mission to bring light and hope to those navigating the darkness of conflict. With your support, we are building paths to healing and resilience for Ukraine's future.

CASE STUDY

Women's Safe House

Ukrainian Patriot's women's shelter is more than a safe space—it's a lifeline for women and children escaping violence and instability. Our Women's Safe House provides a comforting space for up to 15 people, offering them not just refuge, but a chance to rebuild. Many of these women have found purpose working in our warehouse, while others have stepped up to support our broader mission in powerful ways. Some who have moved into new accommodations return to the Safe House to help other women on their journey to recovery, a beautiful example of paying it forward.

One powerful story of many is that of Margarita. She fled years of domestic violence and found not only safety at the Women's Shelter but also work through the cleaning company "Pani. Olena". Now, Margarita is building a brighter future for herself and her child—proof that with the right support, lives can be transformed. Since the autumn of 2024, she has taken on a role within Ukrainian Patriot, demonstrating her movement through the women's rehabilitation programme and her commitment to a better future.

War amplifies everyday struggles, from domestic violence to displacement. Our Safe House also provides a vital lifeline to many internally displaced women and children, helping them navigate precarious situations made even worse by conflict.

Your support helps us continue providing critical shelter, work opportunities, and trauma recovery. Together, we can make a lasting difference in so many lives.

CASE STUDY

Rebuilding in Mykolaiv

At Ukrainian Patriot, rebuilding is more than restoring structures—it's about restoring hope. Blahodatne in Mykolaiv oblast is a village devastated by relentless attacks. Here, our team joined a collaborative effort to help residents rebuild and return to their homes. With the support of a \$15,000 grant, we contributed to a project that has transformed a desolate landscape into a place of renewal.

This initiative, led by a dedicated group of international volunteers, focused on creating a foundation for a new beginning. Over the past year, they constructed several houses and a small community centre, offering a glimmer of normalcy for those displaced. Families have already begun returning, laying the groundwork for a thriving community once again. Our involvement extended beyond financial support. In similar projects across Ukraine, we've provided hands-on assistance, clearing rubble and helping families start over.

The project in Blahodatne is a testament to the power of collaboration, resilience, and hope. We're proud to have played a part in helping this community rebuild its future. Together, we're proving that even in the darkest times, light can be restored.

CASE STUDY

Okhmadyt Children's Hospital



In the wake of the tragic bombing at Okhmadyt Children's Hospital in Kyiv in July 2024, Ukrainian Patriot volunteers were on-site immediately to assist. Upon arrival, we established contact with medical and emergency coordinators to assess the urgent humanitarian and medical needs, both at the site and in the hospitals where patients were relocated. Our dedicated volunteers got to work clearing rubble and providing immediate assistance.

Financial Summary

In 2024, Ukrainian Patriot demonstrated resilience in financial operations across our three entities in Ukraine, Canada, and the U.S. to raise funds effectively to support our mission. Despite challenges, such as global donor fatigue, a changing geopolitical landscape, and increasing demands on resources, Ukrainian Patriot continued to effectively allocate funds to support our mission.

Income and Expenditure

Ukrainian Patriot's finalised accounts for January 2023-December 2023 report a total income of **USD \$292,634.00**:

- **Ukraine: \$16,999** (715,435 UAH)
- **Canada: \$82,635** (\$118,956 CAD)
- **US: \$193,000**

Expenditures totalled **\$321,094**:

- **Ukraine: \$12,211** (513,923 UAH)
- **Canada: \$59,883** (\$86,204 CAD)
- **US: \$249,000**

Operating Costs and Efficiency

Operating costs across all three entities amounted to **\$51,979**, representing **16% of total expenditure**. Each entity managed costs effectively relative to Ukrainian Patriot's income:

- **Ukraine: \$2,549** (107,280 UAH) (15% of income)
- **Canada: \$22,106** (\$31,822 CAD) (27% of income)
- **US: \$27,324** (14.1% of income)

Charitable Activities

The majority of expenditures were directed toward charitable activities, reflecting our dedication to maximising the impact of donor funds.

Free Reserves

Ukrainian Patriot maintained **\$69,522** in free reserves, equivalent to six months of operating costs across its entities:

- **Ukraine: \$4,787** (201,470 UAH)
- **Canada: \$19,735** (\$28,409 CAD)
- **US: \$45,000**

Looking Ahead

Despite a challenging financial landscape, Ukrainian Patriot has upheld its commitment to transparency, efficiency, and impact. Our ability to balance expenditures with reserves ensures sustainability while maintaining focus on our mission to support and rebuild Ukraine's communities. Looking forward, Ukrainian Patriot remains steadfast in our dedication to delivering aid and fostering resilience in the face of adversity.

PTSD AND PSYCHOLOGICAL TRAUMA ASSISTANCE

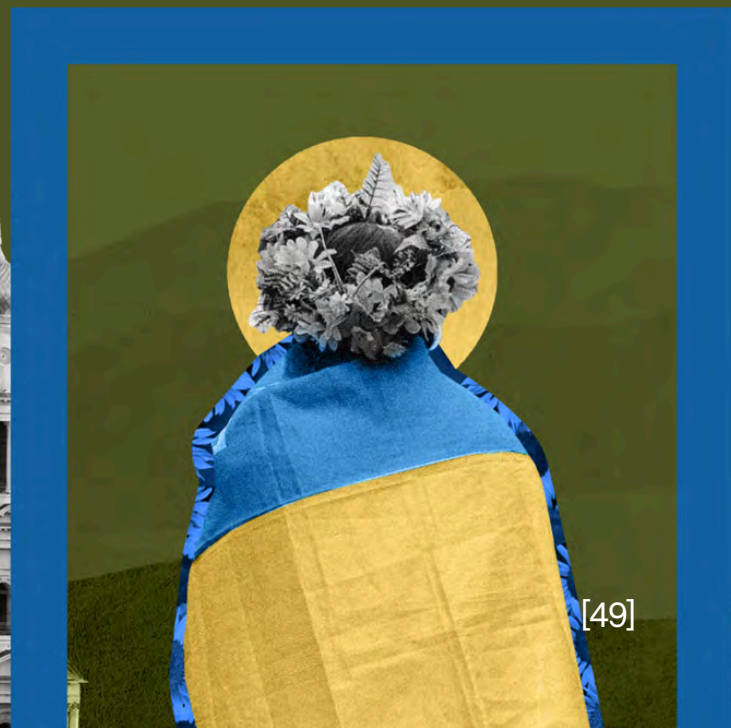
